March 28, 2020 ~Praying for Children, Their Parents, Guardians, and Caregivers~

Father God, in your eyes, we are all your children. Your plans for us and promises to us assure that you will never leave us or forsake us. The days we are living are surely "no matter what" times, and none of your adult children were prepared for the suddenness and seriousness of this coronavirus pandemic.
